

## **COALITION BUILDING**

What is Coalition Building? A coalition is a temporary alliance or partnering of groups in order to achieve a common purpose or to engage in joint activity. Forming coalitions with other groups of similar values, interests and goals allows members to combine their resources and become more powerful than when they each acted alone.

How to Build a Successful Coalition? The early steps center on the recognition of compatible interests. In order to identify potential members one needs to demonstrate:

- 1. The goals are similar and compatible,
- 2. That working together will enhance both groups' abilities to reach their goals, and
- 3. The benefits of coalescing will be greater than the costs. Notes from Brad Spangler, June 2003

#### **Benefits of Coalitions**

- Win on more fronts than a single organization working alone thus increasing the potential for success.
- Can bring more expertise and resources to bear on complex issues.
- ✓ A coalition can develop new leaders. The new emerging leadership strengthens the groups and the coalition.
- ✓ Will increase the impact of each organization's effort. More people who have a better understanding and advocating for the issue.
- ✓ Will increase available resources. Not only will financial resources be increased, but each group will gain access to the contacts, connections, and relationships established by other groups.
- May raise its members' public profiles by broadening the range of groups involved.
- ✓ Can build a lasting base for change. Once groups unite, each group's vision of change broadens and becomes more difficult to dismiss.
- A successful coalition is made of people who have never worked together. Coming from diverse backgrounds and different backgrounds they will learn how to respect each other's differences to achieve "Unity of Purpose". They will decide how each group can make their different yet valuable contribution to the overall strategy. Inquire!

## Walking in God's Love

- **7.** When we walk in love, we put our self aside to **help others**, because love is not self seeking.
- **8.** When we walk in love, we are **not easily angered**, because love keeps no records of wrong.

I am sure that you are aware that there is a growing population with in the prison system that yearns for the word of God. The good news is there is tremendous work being done by volunteers who share God's Holy Word, with those who need His message most.

Many of these inmates are reading their Bible for the very first time and have begun their journey of faith through the support of these volunteer programs. In fact, Bible study, Christian fellowship and Sunday Chapel are some of the best attended programs offered in our correction system.

The real challenge for these new Christians comes after their release from prison; they are keen to continue their journey of faith but do not have a network to support them in their real time of need.

- Christian Fellowship Groups
- Accountability partners

## THAT WE MIGHT BE ONE

"...that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me."

John 17: 21

Many lessons have been learned through building Bridges of Love. One of the most striking and unmistakable is how the watching world appreciates Christians working in "Unity" - a picture of the lion and the lamb lying down together.

This was observed in our first event almost 4 years ago through a concert in Airdrie called, "Country Love". Our vision, to gather all denominations in this smaller city to work towards a common purpose, taught us we can make a greater impact for Christ as we serve the community as one. As different as many of us were, we were developing a spiritually authentic common ground.

In John 17:21, Jesus prays, "That they all may be one...that the world may believe that you have sent me." Jesus is praying for the oneness of the church, the oneness that should be found specifically among ALL true Christians. If an individual does not show love toward other Christians, the world has a right to judge that he is not a Christian. We cannot expect the world to believe that the Father sent the Son, that Jesus' claims are true, and that Christianity is true, unless the world sees some reality of the oneness of true Christians. <sup>1</sup>

#### "The Renewing of Your Mind"

#### Romans 12:2

Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

#### 1 Peter 1:15:16

But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: "Be holy, because I am holy.

In our zeal to serve God are we allowing ourselves to be influenced into thinking we know what God has called us to? Do we fixate on the belief we must do good deeds? Are we driven by the desire to help others and to spread the "good news?" These are noble thoughts and goals but are they of God or of ourselves?

Romans 12:2 speaks of being transformed by the renewing of our minds. Until we can reach that goal will we ever know what God's will is? Clearly it is stated, only when our "thinking" no longer conforms to the pattern of the world, "then we will be able to test and approve what God's will is." The struggle in transforming our lives by the renewing of our minds is we often begin our relationship with Jesus from a worldly perspective. 1 Peter 1:15:16 states that we must be holy in all we do. That is the key to our relationship with Jesus. As we focus on this uncluttered statement, we move our thinking away from a world which legalizes sin, to the morality of how we live. This is the daunting task before us but it is the greater goal than our desire to do good.

As we embark on our "Call of God" the test will be in our reaction to the actions of others. Will we be frustrated or angry because others do not conform? Will we be anxious if the results are not what we had expected?

When we transform our thinking we will become an ambassador for God for we will be one with Him and know His will. Others will see Jesus in us for we will have the character of Christ. God's perfect 'Will' being fulfilled as we live our lives with a renewed mind and changed heart.

Our close walk with God, our willingness to face trials and our desire to ask God for wisdom and understanding will produce a settled spirit in face of fear, isolation, sorrow and doubt.

#### Get Set...

- Be Informed Education is one way to combat fear. Be informed by reading up-todate resources to be prepared to teach others.
- Local Partners/Building Loving Relationships – Pandemic planning will require a response from people in a variety of occupations and disciplines.
- Pandemic Planning Committee Will require those who are committed to gather background work and will encompass several areas of knowledge, skill and ability.
- Proprietary Plans Develop your proprietary plans while cooperating with other planners in areas of mutual interest and concern
- Taking Stock of Resources A church inventory is helpful to assess what resources are already in place.
- 8) **Physical Readiness** The focus of a disaster preparedness plan should be to anticipate not only the resources that will be needed but to have individuals trained and ready to respond at a moments notice.

#### Go...

- Relational Readiness Once the Proprietary plans are in place and the resources on hand assessed, it is time to be intentional in getting to know our neighbours.
- Mutual Assistance Groups A church response to a pandemic is a shared commitment from the whole church body.

## AN OPPORTUNITY TO LOVE ONE ANOTHER... 'True Christianity'

By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you **love one another**."

John 13:35

During Roman times, Christians practiced inexplicable sacrifice and love during times of disaster. Riots, floods, earthquakes, fires, military sieges and plagues constantly threatened to wipe the centers of Roman civilization off the map.

Plagues during these times sealed the fates of 30 to 40 percent of a city's inhabitants. At the onset of plague, the wealthy fled to their country estates. Paganism didn't teach that human life was sacred.

Those who called themselves Christians believed each human being was made in the image of a loving God. They were to extend God's love not merely to their families and friends but to their enemies as well. "Love one another" became their standard.

The care Christians showed often did result in their succumbing to the plague. But paradoxically, their compassion did not deplete Christian ranks in the long term - quite the reverse. Tending to the sick increased the disease survival rate by as much as two-thirds, and this witness attracted many new converts. By acting on the teachings of Christ, without regard to their own welfare, these Christians, against expectations, progressed from being a small sect to the dominant cultural group.

The unprecedented teachings of Christianity gave people a reason to care for the sick and destitute. Only Jesus taught that His followers could find Him in their neighbour.

What was witnessed in the times of the Roman plagues is true Christianity—sacrificial love, concern for all people.

## Low Impact...High Probability

A major flu pandemic is a "low probability, high impact" event. Such an event is unlikely. But if it happens, it's awful...

Dr. Jeremy Farrar at the Hospital for Tropical Disease in Ho Chi Minh City says...

"I think you have to say we really don't know the odds of pandemic, and people are not comfortable with that," Farrar said. "It could fizzle out or it could be something like 200 million dead."

If we focus on the high impact, then even the most improbable scenario is unacceptable, because the outcome is so awful. If we focus on the low probability, then even the prospect of worldwide catastrophe is tolerable, because it is such a long shot.

With respect to a flu pandemic, some people indeed take the approach that this low-probability event is so unlikely it's not worth worrying about. But that approach loses its appeal as you consider higher and higher potential impacts. At some level of impact, the price for being unprepared — the loss — becomes unacceptably high. At that point, we're not only justified but prudent to take protective steps.

Why are federal and local governments, hospitals, major corporations, and others so busy making pandemic plans and preparations? These entities have thought about 'low probability, high impact'...have looked at the characteristics of current strains of the H5N1 virus...have thought about the chances of successfully containing any pandemic virus that might emerge...have thought about how high a 'high impact' might be...and have decided that even if the probability of a pandemic occurring is low – the potential loss demands mitigating action. So they're taking action! Should we not be following their lead??

That describes my opinion with respect to the "bird flu" virus influenza A (H5N1). The potential loss is just too great to leave unaddressed and the opportunity to serve our neighbour has never been better...

"Low Probability" does NOT mean it "never happens"

## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT WITH PURPOSE

"There is a complex relationship between a great bridge and the city in which it resides. Research, understanding, and reflection must precede the work of construction. engineer's greatest pursuit is not so much in making a bridge stand as in making it "a fit"; that is making it an integral, complementing and deepening reality within the community it serves. Bridges, as works of art, do not simply function; they are sensitive, well-conceived, and well-thought-out catalysts of change unique to each community."

The Church of Irresistible Influence

When it comes to building a bridge of meaningful spiritual influence to community, our first act must be to ask, what is this community all about and what their real needs, issues and problems are. We tend to act without asking and therefore minister in a context void of facts and objective understanding.

Only when we have real, objective answers about our community can a ministry strategy begin to emerge that wisely and effectively connects the church to the community. Contextual analysis includes demographics, understanding the power structures of a community, understanding the economic base and understanding what gives the particular ethos of that community.

#### **Pandemic Facts**

- Despite widespread exposures to poultry infected with avian influenza A (H5N1) viruses, influenza A (H5N1) disease in humans remains very rare.
- The median age of patients with influenza A (H5N1) virus infection is approximately 18 years, with 90% of patients 40 years of age or younger and older adults underrepresented.
- Most patients with influenza A (H5N1) virus infection were previously healthy.
- Direct avian-to-human H5N1 virus transmission is the predominant means of human infection.
- The influenza A (H5N1) virus can also infect multiple mammalian hosts, including domestic cats and dogs.
- After exposure to infected poultry, the incubation period generally appears to be 7 days or less, and in many cases this period is 2 to 5 days.
- Avian influenza A viruses are readily inactivated by a variety of chemical agents and physical conditions, including soaps, detergents, alcohols, and chlorination.

## IS IT TIME FOR THE 'PARABOLANI' TO RE-EMERGE?

"In the wake of the First World War a huge influenza pandemic swept the world, and it is estimated to have killed up to a 100 million people world wide. 20,000 died in Canada – the so-called Spanish Flu saw more people parish in 25 weeks than AIDS has killed in 25 years."

Over the past few years we are hearing more and more on the Avian Flu (H5N1) as being the next Pandemic. The jury is still out on whether this is the 'big one' that folks have been expecting; but, as researchers say, even if it isn't, it is only a matter of time before influenza or something akin to it mutates, jumps from other species, and begins to wreak havoc.

We have learned from previous influenza pandemics there is compelling evidence that preparation by governments is not enough to completely lessen the impact of a future influenza pandemic without the support of the private sector.

We have an opportunity like never before to put our faith into **action**. The early church was characterized by generosity and sacrifice. Christians were not afraid to die. There was an association of men and women called the *'Parabolini'* the gamblers. It was their aim to visit the prisoners and the sick, especially those who were ill with dangerous and infectious diseases. In AD 252, plague broke out in Carthage; the Bishop, gathered his congregation together and put them to work burying the dead and nursing the sick in that plague-stricken city; and by so doing, at the risk of their lives, they saved the city from destruction and desolation. (Barclay). They knew that death was not the end...

This small group of early Christians had introduced a new vision of humanity to the Roman World that was observable – not in organized programs of the church but in the lives of those outside the church which drew many to the faith.

Do we know that a pandemic will occur in the next year or two? No... Does it matter? No... Why not? A pandemic is a near certainty and the signs have never been accumulating wider and faster. Whether it comes or not is not the defining matter, however. What should compel our actions is our love for God. The process of becoming more Christ-like as we grow in compassion and love for our neighbour is the gift we give ourselves. 'BBYSSIW' (Luke 5:5 – NIV)

# Practically Speaking... What Can the Church do?

When many normal services break down, quite elementary nursing will greatly reduce mortality, simple provision of food and water, for instance, will allow persons to recover who are temporarily too weak to cope for themselves.

- Spiritual Readiness: Any intention to practically meet the needs of sick and dying people, should a pandemic become a reality, will be actualized by people who are intimately connected to Jesus. It depends not so much on how merciful we are, but on how deeply we ourselves love the Lord.
- 2) Physical Readiness: Personal commitments and uniting our efforts under God's Authority bring power. Could a system be in place to network, mobilize and equip bothers and sisters in Christ to be prepared?
- 3) Relational Readiness: Do we know our Neighbours? Building relationships in a 'real' way is the key. It is critical to be intentional in our efforts to meet others where they are.

## **A Church Prepared**

- Biblical Response During any crisis, many questions arise about God. As such, we need more than ever to be ready with a response for the hope that lies within us.
- Prayer Opportunity Prayer should be the first response and priority in any situation.
- Small Groups Will play an integral role in building Neighbourhood mutual assistant groups (MAGS). Prayer gatherings, home churches, counseling, food preparation and delivery, child care, communication...
- Education/Training/Equipping The focus of a disaster preparedness plan should be to anticipate what is needed to respond to warning and to take action prior to the emergency.
- Partnerships Necessary to collaborate with other stakeholders demonstrating a spirit of teamwork.
- > **Communication** A pandemic of global proportions will require a global response.
- > **New Sites** In times of crisis people often seek a church for peace & comfort.

## THROUGH THE EYES OF LOVE...

#### Follow Me...

Since God has commanded us to firstly, love Him and then our neighbour, Pandemic Preparedness is an open door for the Great Commandment to be fulfilled...we can look at this adventure through the eyes of love!

Ten years have passed since the H5N1 strain of avian influenza first grabbed international attention by causing the death of a 3 year-old boy living in Hong Kong. Since this time, the World Health Organization (WHO) has reported this novel virus moving across the globe, causing 332 known human illnesses and 204 deaths in 12 countries. Not only is there human suffering but also there has been the slaughter of hundreds of millions of birds, as a preventative measure, to try and keep the virus under control.

The avian flu and the prospects of a potential human pandemic has risen and fallen in public attention. Are we becoming complacent to this threat which has the ability to turn our world up-side down? Even though the threat of an Influenza Pandemic is low priority for most ... the scientific attention to the H5N1 continues its quest for a vaccine against this formable enemy.

According to a recent article written from the Center for Infectious Disease, Research and Policy..."after almost a decade of research, a safe, effective, affordable, and abundant vaccine against H5N1 flu remains disappointingly out of reach. The search for a human avian-flu vaccine that could be developed and delivered in time to shortcircuit a pandemic has been dogged by multiple obstacles across many sectors. They include patchy scientific knowledge, sparse government fundina. thin manufacturing and packaging capability, and restrictive regulatory structures—along with the wily immunology of the H5N1 virus itself." ...Maryn McKenna

As the WHO admitted in its Global Pandemic Influenza Action Plan published last year, "At the present time, if an influenza pandemic were to occur, the potential vaccine supply would fall several billion doses short of the amount needed to provide protection worldwide.

#### Awareness and Education

There is a great deal of effort under way, at a global, national, provincial and regional level to anticipate and respond effectively to pandemic influenza. Minimizing the impact of this pandemic will be through education and prior preparedness as well as collective efforts from many stakeholders in a community. The church can play an integral role to assist the health authorities as a Pandemic influenza will place great pressure on health and social services alike

#### What is pandemic influenza?

Pandemic influenza is a type of influenza that occurs every few decades and spreads rapidly to affect most countries and regions around the world.

#### Some facts about Pandemic Influenza...

- Until the virus is identified it is not possible to make a vaccine.
- Pandemic influenza will spread very rapidly because people will have no immunity.
- Experts predict the global death toll could range between 2 million to over 50 million deaths. (conservative figures)
- Groups at particular risk won't be known until the disease starts to circulate—but may be different from those age groups normally affected.(similar to 1918 Flu)
- Antivirals are being stockpiled but they have limitations---their effectiveness won't be known until the virus is circulating.
- Pandemic is NOT a Health Issue...it is a SOCIETAL Issue.

#### How does an influenza pandemic start?

Influenza viruses are constantly changing, producing new strains and varieties. Pandemics occur when a virus emerges that is so different from previously circulating strains that few, if any, people have any immunity to it. This allows it to spread widely and rapidly, affecting many hundreds of thousands of people. A new pandemic virus may be the result of an animal virus and a human virus mixing to produce a new strain. The animal virus usually comes from birds. Three pandemics occurred in the last century. Scientists predict that another pandemic will happen, although they cannot say exactly when.
